Villa Hills Police Department Yearly report

The Villa Hills Police Department serves the communities of Villa Hills and Crescent Springs. Villa Hills is a community in the northwestern portion of Kenton County. The Villa Hills community is 4.35 square miles with 7,469 residents. The community is mostly residential with a very few businesses. The community has three schools and an assisted living facility. During this year the community has expanded with a new subdivision and the expansion of the nursing home facility to add assisted living condominiums

The City of Crescent Springs is located east of the city of Villa Hills. This community is 1.5 square miles with approximately 4,084 residents. The community is a breakup of residential, rental, and retail space. The residents are approximately 40% rental and 60% home ownership. The city also has interstate I-75 located in the boundaries and is responsible for approximately 1 mile of the interstate for law enforcement matters. The City of Crescent Springs has entered into an agreement with the City of Villa Hills to provide police service to that city. This contract has recently been extended to the year 2030. This partnership both cities have developed in the police realm has led to better service to both communities.

Year in Review

Villa Hill Police Department

The contract and the partnership between the cities of Villa Hills and Crescent Springs continue to go very well. I feel this partnership will benefit all involved. The department practices a community based proactive approach to policing and the eradication of crime in our communities. The department has continued to grow and evolve in our abilities and specialties. We have added two officers to serve as Detectives. This allows the department to work the crimes we get in better detail. We have added a fifteenth police officer to the department. The addition of the officer allows a reorganization of the agency to prepare it for the future of policing and to serve the communities. We have added a Lieutenants position who will serve in an administrative position as well as a supervisory position. The person filling this roll will assist in the duties that the Sergeants were given. The role of the Sergeant has been modified to allow for more of a front line supervisory role to do more street supervision. The changes will prepare the department for the changes in the future.

Grant Funding

The Department has received grant funding and has reapplied for the grants for the year 2022. The grants have allowed the department to use money for special items and equipment to better the agency. The following are the grants we have received and have reapplied for:

- Office of Highway Safety General Traffic Enforcement Grant \$13,900.00
- Kentucky Office of Highway Safety I-75 Corridor Grant-\$17,000.00
- Crescent Springs Home Depot Equipment Grant \$1,000.00
- Norfolk Southern Discretionary Fund- \$2,500.00

Traffic Safety/Safety Programs

The Department continues to work on traffic safety issues using the grant funding to put overtime details at no additional costs to the cities. We also invested in the speed signs and radar trailer that allows the department to look at trouble areas to determine if there is an issue and to rectify these issues.

Canine Program

The canine program has been a great asset to the department. The Villa Hill Police Canine unit is considered top in the area and region. The unit will be awarded the NAPWDA Certificate of Valor and the Unit Citation for the outstanding work they have done. This is a National recognition and well deserved. The canine unit has had 135 deployments this year. The deployments have resulted in 12 subject apprehensions, seizure of approximately \$21,675.00 in drug money and 13 weapons. On top of this the unit has seized several pounds of narcotics and intercepting them stopping the inflow into our communities. The canine unit also recertified nationally through NAPWDA.

Three Year Plan

State Accreditation

We will begin the process of preparing for the upcoming Accreditation in 2024. We will continue yearly policy reviews and training. In 2023 we will begin the work of the process and defined in the accreditation process.

Supervisor Development

As indicated earlier we have formed a Lieutenants position. This position is meant to be an additional administrative position and the assistant to the chief. This position will pull administrative duties from the Sergeants and allow them more time to do street supervision. The Lieutenant will act as the Chief in his absence with the idea that when the chief leaves the department has a viable internal candidate. The Lieutenant will also be responding to calls for service as the Chief currently does. The department also promoted two new Sergeants. The Sergeants will be trained in management philosophy and modern policing philosophies. The training will include Command school through the DOCJT. The supervisors will be freed of administrative functions and be utilized for more street level supervisory needs and functions.


Department organization

The addition of the fifteenth officer will allow a changing in the organization of the department personnel. The changes will give the detectives more free time to investigate and close cases. We will also reorganize the scheduling to utilize manpower based of the needs as we observe them based on monthly reports.


Community Relations

The department will continue to push forward a proactive Community Relations program. We will continue with such programs as RAD, Shop with a Police and Fire Fighter, School Resource programs and such. These programs have been a valuable asset to the community and have developed a great relationship with the police and community. The Department plans to embark on assisting the different neighborhoods with setting up Neighborhood Watch program. We will also incorporate Post Critical Incident System (PCIS) into the department. This system assists with the stressors of the job and assists the officers in the stresses of incidents in the department. We have an officer already certifies and a counselor in the program and will untilize going forward.



The calls for service dropped from the previous year.





The agency activity remained the same. Citation and courtesies went down but the JC- 3 category went up. It is believed the COVID situation had a factor in the rise in the domestic situation. The Department had 9 Use of Force reports. All Use of Force Reports were justified per Kentucky Revised Statue and Policy and Procedure.



Total crime remained the same. The only change was the murder and rise in car thefts. We also saw a rise in sexual assaults and intimidation.








Villa Hills Police Department 2021 Annual Investigations report

In 2021 the detective was assigned 50 new cases. These cases included vehicle thefts (2), sexual assaults (10), abuse/neglect of minors (6), death investigations (3), burglary (3), drug investigations (3), theft (8), harassment (2), physical assaults/ Domestics (4), Threats (1), property damage (3), Forgery (1), wanton endangerment (1), attempted murder (1), and fraud (4).

The months of May and August saw the highest increase in new cases.

2 investigations were reopened in 2021, due to new evidence and identification of suspects: 2020-00786 (Burglary 3rd) and 2021-07613 (Theft of Automobile). This made the total investigated cases for the year, 52.

A total of 32 cases were closed in 2021 (61%), and 14 cases were moved to "Inactive" status due to lack of investigative leads (27%).



At end of year, there are 5 active cases still under investigation, and 2 cases currently under review by Prosecution for charges.

In 2021 VHPD investigations worked with neighboring police and federal officers on a large-scale vehicle theft ring that affected the tristate area. Multiple suspects were identified through the effort, and at least one vehicle theft case from Villa Hills was closed with this information.


One report of terroristic threats was investigated and passed on to the FBI.



- Officer Lucas is a certified Arson Investigator and a Member of Kenton County Arson Task Force




